Response was requested from the Napa County Sheriff's Office to Finding 1 and Recommendation 2 of the section covering "Napa County Department of Corrections/County Jail", in the 2010-2011 Napa County Grand Jury Report.

Finding 1

The Napa County Jail is one of two remaining county jails operating with a Director of Corrections under the authority of the Board of Supervisors rather than the Sheriff.

## Recommendation 2

The Department of Corrections Director prepare and present a report to the Board of Supervisors that evaluates the feasibility, benefits and cost savings of having the Department of Corrections re-organize under the Napa County Sheriff.

## Response to Recommendation 2

The Sheriff neither agrees nor disagrees with this finding. The Board of Supervisors has previously indicated they were not interested in transferring responsibility for the jail to the Sheriff. As recently as 2007, the then-Grand Jury identified a number of "advantages" of placing the jail function under the Sheriff. Those advantages were evaluated and the decision was made to maintain Board of Supervisors control over the jail.
